Prof Dr Elías Hurtado Hoyo

He was born in Valencia (Spain) in 1937 and after that he settled in Argentine in 1940.

In 1959 Physician at the University of Medicine, Buenos Aires, Argentine (UBA) ; in 1960 Doctor in Medicine with the thesis about Lung Cancer.

In care he was formatted in Surgery like Resident of the Institute of Medical Surgical Improvement "Dr Jorge"; during 1971 he was designated like Leader of Thoracic Surgery at the Carlos Durand Hospital (Buenos Aires. Argentine). Later he served as Chief of the Argerich Hospital (Buenos Aires. Argentine) (1980); Chief of the Surgery Department at the Tornu General Hospital (Buenos Aires. Argentine) (1981-1989) and of the same Service Charge at the Carlos Durand General Hospital (1990-2005). During the period 1996-2001 he was General Director of Health Attention of the Buenos Aires City Government (33 Public Hospitals) of the Autonomy City of Buenos Aires. Argentine.

In investigation he won the National scholarship of the University of Buenos Aires (UBA) in 1961 and of he was foreign scholarship at the "Sanitary City La Paz" (Madrid, Spain) that was given for the "Institut of Hispanic Culture " (1974-75)

He has dedicated at the clinical investigation and he develops personal techniques to arrive to the thorax less aggressive than the current methods. His Axillary Thoractomys was accepted and used in many nationals and foreign Centers. His originals investigations in Lung Cancer and other items had been recognized internationally. He changed the previous concepts about these items. Since 1991 was used the Thoracoscopy Surgery by Video in all de world.

He earned the rewards Jose Penna (UBA) 1960; "Argentine Society of Cancerology" (1984-85); Argentine Association of Surgery" 1984; the National Reward at the Medical Knowledge of the Department of Education and Justice (1984-1988) ; "Raimondi" (1988-89); "Ovidio Bolo" (1989); "Leston" (1990) ; "European School of Oncology" (1995); of the "Spanishness" (1995 and 2003) ; "Sobrafir", Brasil (1996) " Andrés Santas (2002) of the Argentine Association of Surgery"; "Andes's Teacher", Chile (1995); and others.

In 1999 he was designed "Master of the Argentine Medicine" and during 2013 "Master of the Argentine Thoracic Surgery. During 2014 he was designed "Extraordinary Consultant to the Argentine Army and the Central Military Hospital Cosme Argerich" and "Leading to the development by the Argentine Nations' Senate".

Always he was related to university teaching undergraduate and graduate from 1957 to date. From 1994 to 2005 he was Titular Professor of Surgery (UBA); Illustrious Visitor of the University of Tucuman, Argentine (2005); Honorary Professor of the Aconcagua's University Mendoza, Argentine (2013).

He has given more than 300 conferences and has published more than 150 scientific works, 14 books and 24 chapters of different books about medicine. He wrote 36 prologues of others thematic. He was jury in more than 150 Contests and Awards. He was Director of some Doctorate's Thesis, in Residence Programs or nationals and foreign Scholarship too. His numerous disciples take care managers and teachers hierarchy centers of the country and abroad. Ex Director of the Career of Specialist in Thoracic Surgery (UBA)(1986-2005); Chairman of the Advisory Board of the Graduate School (EGAMA) (2004 until today)

Since 1996 he programmed and directed the Distance Medical Education of AMA as the Medical Digital's Library (BMD), the Latin American Program (PLEMED) and today he develops EDUVIRAMA www.ama-med.org.ar

During 1991 he was the President of the Surgery College and he organized the "Recertification" (1987-1988) that was the first in the country. In 1991 he was invited to operate "in vivo" in the Italian Congress of Surgery at the Regina Elena Hospital La Sapienza University, Rome Italy, by Eugenio Santoro. He was Co President with Umberto Veronesi during the Congress of the European School of Oncology in Buenos Aires, Argentine (1999).

During 1994 he organized the Recertification System in the Argentine Medical Association (22500 inscripts) and was his President (1994-1998). He was Ex President of the Argentine Society of Thoracic Surgery and Cardiovascular (1985), of Neumology and Thoracic Pathology (1990) and others.

He was Vice president of the International College of Surgeons (1998-2005); Consultant for national and international scientific publications; Creator of the Medical Experts Committee for Federal Jurisdictions and to the Supreme Court of Justice of the Nation (2001 and 2006 respectively).

In the humanistic plane he spoke among others, on the Literary and Scientific Athenaeum, Madrid (Spain) on the occasion of the edition of his book "The Everlasting Man. Theory of being" (1975). He was awarded twice (1996 and 2004) with the Medal of the Hispanic community of Spanish companies; with the "Order of St. Paul's" by the Greek Orthodox Church (2001) and received the Paul Harris Award by the International Rotary Club (2002).

In the last 20 years he facing issues of Professional Practice as: a) describes the legal medical syndrome (1993); b) Program and directs the book "Code of Ethics for the Health Team of the Argentine Medical Association", 1° Edition (2001) and 2° (2011). It was translated into Greek, English, French, Portuguese, Russian, Arabic, Hebrew, Italian, Japanese, Dutch, German, Czech and mandarin Chinese www.ama-med.org.ar. It started the Armenian translation.

Currently he's Professor of Surgery Consult of the Medicine School (UBA) Argentine (2005); Titular Member of the Surgery Argentine Academy (1981); Titular of the Ethic Academy in Medicine (2006); Corresponding Member of the National Academy of Medical Sciences of Cordoba. Argentine (2003); Foreign Correspondent Member of the National Academy of Medicine, Paraguay (2004); Foreign Associate Member of the National Academy of Medicine of France (2015); Doctor Honoris Causa of the University of Moron, Argentine(2009) and Doctor Honoris Causa of the University Health Sciences Institute of the Barceló Foundation, Argentine (2009); President of the Argentine Medical Association for six periods (1998-2015).
